

1. Taneční projekt, Rakousko

Dancing is body language in motion. Therefore it is the possibility to start to talk with others within a group or with other groups devoid of origin, sex, religion or social status. To our project „Tanz der Kulturen“ (cultural dancing) we invite youth groups of other countries which are practicing any kind of special dance (for example: break dance, renaissance dance, standard dance, latin dance, folklore dance, gaelic dance, tap dance, etc.) to Linz.

Our target groups are boys and girls between 14 and 23 years which are able to introduce other youths to their particular form of dancing. Therefore every nation will get a whole day of one week to present its country and dance, as well as to enable the others to take part. In collaboration with pedagogues (youth workers), choreographers and the different dancers a mix of the diverse dancing cultures should be elaborated. In the end of the week the results will be performed at a show in public space.

The project will be carried out in the first week of September 2009. A weekend to prepare the project with the youth workers which accompany and lead the groups will take place in July 2009.

The main goal of the project is to develop and implement brand new study program promoting support and trust based cooperation between police institutions and society paying special attention to individuals below the age of 18.

The main concept of the cooperation project consists of three major parts:

Research. Good praxis among partner institutions / countries have been collected, shared and analysed in order to find the problem factors, collect needs of all parts involved (police, individual, society), analyse both theoretical and practical research done so far;

Creation of study program. In order to develop brand new study program the strong emphasis on on-going research will be put. Creativity, new approach and good praxis will be three major indicators that affect the creation of the study program;

Implementation of study program. Implementation of the program will be introduced in specific ways involving all parties. Pilot-project of study program has been planned in order to analyse the outcomes of the program. New informative platform and study materials will be developed.

Currently we are looking for partners that are eligible and interested to participate in the realisation process of the cooperation project.

In order to participate in Daphne III Programme as Partner, the applicants must comply with the following requirements:

Legal status: They are public or private organisations and institutions (glocal authorities at the relevant level, university departments and research centres) working to prevent and combat violence against children, young people and women; or to protect against such violence; or to provide support for victims; or to implement targeted actions to promote rejection of such violence; or to encourage attitude and behaviour change towards vulnerable groups and victims of violence.
